Information and alerts, including their bi-monthly newsletter, are shared appropriately via email, website, Facebook page, and YouTube channel.

Per Capita for 2023

It's the time of year we are assessed by the presbytery for this congregation's per capita apportionment. The presbytery passes along the portion of the per capita which is allotted to the synod and General Assembly based upon local church membership numbers. In every case, any shortfall from nonpayment by a member is made up out of reserves. The annual assessment is based on our verified membership number from two years prior. FPC's 2023 apportionment on our membership as of 12/31/2021, is for a total individual per capita of \$53. Of this amount, \$40 goes to the presbytery, \$3 to the synod, and \$10 to the General Assembly. Your per capita contribution of \$53 per member will reduce FPC's operating costs in 2023 and support the work and ministry of Presbyterians locally, nationally, and globally for the sake of our shared ministry of the good news of Jesus Christ. You may send your per capita payment to the church, or drop it in the collection plate. In either case, please note on the check that it is for per capita and include your envelope number. Your partnership in the life and ministry of this church and support of our governing bodies is appreciated.
