CLERK'S CORNER April 16, 2023 Session Recap

Pastor Joe Hinds opened our meeting with prayer. He thanked Diane for providing lunch. The Clerk reported a quorum was present.

The March 2023 Financial Report prepared by Carolyn McMillan was received: total income YTD for 2023 was \$72,565.21; total expenses \$65,852.33; net \$6,712.88.

Session approved:

- the March 19, 2023 minutes with a note that David is in the class of 2024, not 2025.
- Our membership roll total is 88.
- the Pastor's report of visitations, contacts made through email, postal mail, text, and phone, leading the ongoing Cornerstone class study, and meetings attended.
- canceling the May meeting. If business occurs that needs our vote, we will conduct via email.
 The next session meeting will be held on June 18, 2023 following worship.

Committee Reports:

<u>CLS</u>: The Heifer International project was a success. Between the money collected by the children and a matching donation, almost \$2,000 will go to Heifer International. The committee is planning a Sunday Fun Day on May 21 following worship. With funds from the Matthew 25 grant, two small library boxes—

one for books and one as a pantry — were purchased from Little Free Library and will be installed outside once a suitable location is chosen. Kim has agreed to oversee the books and pantry items in these boxes.

Operations - Property: Session approved the expense of \$7,720 to repair deteriorating concrete and asphalt items. Large commercial semi-trucks have been using the lower drive to park while the driver goes into Speedway. This has caused a breakdown in the asphalt. Someway to prevent this parking was discussed. Curtains and blinds will be closed when rooms are not being used. This is a security issue to prevent individuals peering in the windows, especially at night. It should also aid in the regulation of the air conditioning and heating. Mitch is still working on the roof issues related to the copper roof over the portico. Other repairs around the building are in process. Please NOTE: Property has made the following request: Any items in the church that are stored there which have a sentimental or are of value to anyone who donated that item, that they be marked somehow so they do not get thrown away during clean up periods in the church.




Hosting the Miami Valley Presbytery Meeting May 9th




Dear Church Family,
