CLERK'S CORNERNovember 16, 2025 Session Recap

Pastor Joe opened with prayer and thanked Kim for providing lunch. The Clerk confirmed a quorum was present. We also had

two guests.

The guests, PMV Stated Clerk, Lynn Bova, and COM liaison Jay Peterson were here to discuss and answer questions related to Pastor Joe's retirement and the steps we need to discuss to move forward after his departure. Until his departure, our focus should be to celebrate Pastor Joe and the leadership and care he has provided the last five years. After his departure, the congregation needs to allow itself time to grieve. Session watched the final Boundary training video, Protecting Children, Youth and Vulnerable Adults.

Session approved/accepted:

- the October meeting minutes.
- the current membership roll total of 80.The clerk reported that Session records were approved without exception on November 1.
- the financial report for the period 01/01/25 –
 10/31/25. Total expenses YTD in 2025 were \$179,742.91 versus income of \$154,943.67 for a net loss of \$-24,799.24.
- the transfer of \$40,000 from the Davis Fund to checking to pay for the air handler and all necessary items to complete the removal and installation.
- January 25, 2026 for the Annual Congregational to receive the 2025 Annual report.
- the next Session meeting to be held on January 18, 2026, following worship. Kathleen will provide lunch.



Our pledge drive for 2026 started with a letter that had the phrase "the will of the Lord be done". This was a phrase we heard in our Cornerstone class when we studied the travels of Paul in the book of Acts. Paul was walking great distances preaching and teaching, and his message that Jesus was the Messiah was not well received. Many actually wanted him killed for this message. Paul's friends begged him to change his mind on one particular destination, but to no avail. Paul was on a mission from God and in the end his friends just said "The will of the Lord be done."

I wish that I was always as certain of God's will as Paul had been. I wish it were as clear as addition and subtraction. I feel pretty clear on the outcomes that are pleasing to God, but struggle with the steps needed to get there. But I try, and thankfully I do not have to be perfect, and I am forgiven when I get it completely wrong. There are many ways to support our church, and financial support is critical.

For 2026 we received 26 pledge cards that totaled \$77,000.

For 2025 we received 31 pledge cards that totaled \$98,000.

For 2024 we received 36 pledge cards that totaled \$113,000.
