Pastor Joe opened with prayer and thanked Kim for providing lunch. The Clerk confirmed a quorum was present.

Session reviewed and/or approved:

- the June 22 meeting minutes.
- the current membership roll total of 82.
- the financial report for the period 01/01/25 06/30/25. YTD income \$ 104,213.10, expenses \$105,264.64 for a net loss of \$1,051.54.
- replacement of the ProSource copier in the office.
- moving the next Session meeting to September 21 following worship.

Information received:

- Pastor Joe will send us his June-July report.
- Pastor Joe announced he will be retiring July 2026. He will advise the congregation from the pulpit on Sunday, August 10. He will follow up with a letter to all members.
- The session received the Closing Prayer list. The list shows which member of the Session is responsible for closing the monthly meeting with prayer.
- The session received a copy of *Instructions for Serving Communion*.

Committee Reports:

<u>CLS:</u> The committee is planning a *Sunday Fun Day* in

September. Watch the Lifeline and Mid-Week update for specifics once the committee has finalized the date.

Operations:

<u>Property</u>: The committee has a meeting scheduled with the HVAC contractor to discuss AC concerns and the possibility of replacing units in the sanctuary area.

The Boiler needs a replacement part which is costly and could take 4 to 6 weeks. This is still in process. A section of roofing needs repaired. Gutters and downspouts need replacing. Still in process. Wells & Sons has been contracted to clean the Fellowship Floor.

<u>Nominations</u>: The committee plans to meet in September to work on the officer's slate. The final slate of officers and Members at Large from the Congregation will be presented at the Congregation meeting in October.
